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Full paper should be written in English (MS Word for Windows), not more than ten pages, Times New Roman 12 pt, justified, line spacing 1.

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Submission of a manuscript implies that the work has not been published before, that it is not under consideration for publication elsewhere, and that it will not be submitted to another journal while under review for Croatian Operational Research Review. Authors are encouraged to submit their manuscript using our *Online submission system*, registering as an author. The corresponding author will receive all correspondence, including an initial acknowledgement and the decision, by email.

2. Guide for authors

2.1. Submission of manuscript

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2.1.1. Initial submission (manuscript to review)

The initial version of manuscript should be written using Word or Latex program by using an appropriate template given in Author guidelines. If written in Word, it should be submitted as a **.docx** file (with author names in the separate page). If it is written in Latex program, it should be submitted as a **.pdf** file. After the reviewing process, if the paper is accepted for publishing in this journal, the author will be asked to submit a final .docx or .tex version of the manuscript. The easiest way to prepare your manuscript is to download the *Word paper template file* or *Latex paper template file*, from the web page of the CRORR journal.

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- *Author names and affiliations*. For each author add his/her affiliation which should include the full postal address and the country name. If available, specify the e-mail address of each author. Clearly indicate who is the corresponding author of the paper.
- *Abstract*. A concise abstract is required. The abstract should state the problem studied and the principal results proven.
- *Keywords* (at least two, up to six key words).
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- *References*. References in the text are cited by numbers in square brackets, e.g. [1]. A full list of references should be given at the end of the manuscript in alphabetical order by the first author's last name and formatted as it is in this template article. Ensure the references are quoted accurately, and use the standard abbreviations for journal names prepared by the American Mathematical Society (see Mathematical Reviews Serials Abbreviations List). Unpublished materials should not appear in the reference list.
